**POSTAGE RATE REVISIONS**

---

Singapore Post Limited (“SingPost”) wishes to announce that with effect from 18 December 2006, postage rates for domestic and international mail services will be revised as follows:

**a) Domestic mail postage rates**

Postage for ordinary domestic mail in the first weight-step of 20g will be increased by two cents from 23 cents to 25 cents.

**b) International airmail postage rates**

For Zone 1 countries (Malaysia and Brunei), there will be a five cents increase for the weight-steps of 20g, 50g and 100g. For every additional 100g thereafter, postage will cost 20 cents more.

For Zone 2 countries namely Asia and Pacific (excluding Japan, Australia and New Zealand), there will be an increase of five cents to the postage of mail in the 20g weight-step.

Zone 3 and Zone 4 will be merged into one category and be known as Zone 3. The new Zone 3 comprises the rest of the world including Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Africa, America, Europe and Middle East. With the merger of the two zones, the postage rates will be aligned, with the first weight-step of 20g pegged at \$1.10. It will cost 35 cents for every additional 10g thereafter.

**c) Registration fee**

The fee for registered mail for both domestic and international delivery will be revised from \$2.00 to \$2.20.

This is the first effective domestic postage rate increase in 11 years despite inflationary increases in operating costs over the years. Similarly, international airmail postage rate has not been revised since 2000.

Overall, the rate revisions will mitigate cost increases and are not expected to have a material financial impact on SingPost in this financial year ending 31 March 2007.
